### \*Top Tips\*

- All members of the Coventry VCSE Alliance are required to create an <u>organisation</u> <u>profile</u> on our community engagement platform, "<u>Get Involved Coventry</u>". The site has multiple functions and analytic tools to help support with volunteer recruitment, promotion of events, projects, and services
- Make sure colleagues, wider staff team and volunteers across your organisation know about your membership, our <u>Manifesto</u>, and have access to any of our services that can support them in the work they do
- Get to know the <u>staff</u> at Voluntary Action Coventry: we are also here for referrals of clients to and from our support, partnership work across projects or developing new work in the city

### **Member Support Services**



#### Volunteer Brokerage and how we champion volunteering

VAC promotes volunteering, community action and the power of participation and engagement to the people of Coventry. We do this through outreach events and presentations, volunteer information and support drop-in sessions, online and social media platforms, our supported volunteering projects, and our online platform, Get Involved Coventry.

Through the VCSE Alliance, our staff build up a detailed knowledge of the volunteering landscape in Coventry, and work closely with individuals and communities to best match them with the roles and wider support the VCSE sector offers.

### Advertising volunteer roles and engaging with volunteers

Get Involved Coventry is our dedicated community engagement site. Coventry VCSE Alliance members each create an <u>organisation profile</u> for inclusion in our <u>Community</u> <u>Directory</u> and have the option to add activities for the community to take part in:

- Volunteer roles these could be one-off tasks, volunteer support at events, short term, or ongoing opportunities. Volunteers can apply directly via our platform using custom-created or imported application forms
- **Events** advertise community events, fairs, open days, family fun days or fundraisers
- **Workshops** allow people to book onto volunteer information or taster sessions, project workshops or training

#### Volunteering Events and Community Outreach

We both hold and coordinate, and attend, stakeholder and community events to promote volunteering as this is the best way to reach communities, and we champion not only VAC services but those of our Alliance members too.

From large scale volunteering and community fairs with stalls for the public to engage with, to presentations, delivering activities and Q&A sessions for different cohorts and communities, there are many ways we can provide you with opportunities to raise awareness of your support and services, and encourage Coventry residents to volunteer their time in support of this.

You are also able to promote and advertise your own events on Get Involved Coventry.

### Volunteer drop-in and education

Our face-to-face Volunteer Centre offer helps people access volunteering or identify the right role for them and takes three main forms, each offering different levels and timescales of support:

- Volunteer drop-in: ad hoc advice for anyone seeking guidance around volunteering
- Introduction to Volunteering workshops: 2-hour activity and discussion-based session giving comprehensive information on volunteering, how to find suitable roles, and demystifying volunteer recruitment processes
- **Supported Volunteering**: our Improving Lives project provides targeted community and classroom-based support to build confidence and skills in those interested in trying volunteering but experiencing barriers to their participation

Every week, we shine a spotlight on one volunteer opportunity advertised on Get Involved Coventry by featuring it across our social media channels as our "**Role of the Week**". If we select your role, we will tag your organisation, and encourage you to interact with the posts. Commenting or starting a conversation on these posts can really help potential volunteers to engage, too.

We also celebrate existing volunteers via our "**Volunteer Spotlight**" social media posts. To nominate a volunteer, <u>contact us</u>. You will need to provide descriptive narrative of the difference they are making, along with their photo and permission to feature them. We operate a rolling nomination pool, meaning if your volunteer is not chosen this time, they still have the opportunity in future.

### Community Directory

You will need to <u>create an organisation profile</u> on Get Involved Coventry to feature in our <u>Community Directory</u>.

The directory provides an interactive map of third sector services across Coventry and a straightforward way for potential service users, social prescribers and corporate organisations seeking charity partners to find and connect with you. You have responsibility for your organisation profile, so do ensure this is kept up to date and looks engaging.

#### Volunteer Coordinator Support Network (VCSN)

This support service is specifically aimed at those who have responsibility for or assist with the recruitment, management, training, or support of volunteers. It includes access to monthly meetings, and the option to be part of the VCSN outlook group.

#### **VCSN** meetings

If linking in with other VCSE organisations would be useful to you, dates and times of our Volunteer Coordinator Support Network online meetings can be found <u>here</u>.

VCSN meetings take place monthly, with both online and face to face options. They are an informal space to connect with, seek advice from and offer your experience and support to peers across a range of organisations with volunteering related topics and challenges.

#### VCSN outlook group

The outlook group is primarily provided for Volunteer Coordinators to receive information and updates from VAC that are relevant to the work they do – expect to receive links to useful websites and training, resources, signposting, meeting, and networking information along with connections from corporate volunteer teams. #### <u>Ebulletin</u>

VAC produces ten editions of our ebulletin per year, solely for our Alliance members with a focus on voluntary sector-specific content. We share updates on VAC projects and activity, and a monthly digest of national and regional funding, events, training, and sector news. You need to <u>subscribe</u> to receive our mailings.

Also included in the ebulletin is a "**Member News**" section. Please <u>email</u> content you would like us to share.

#### Sector Networking and Forums

From time to time, VAC coordinates events and ways for our Alliance to share and explore certain themes. These include things like our Annual General Meeting (AGM), networking events and meet-ups, online surveys, and support forums.
